We will observe IFOLG judging categories and standards. However, this is an OPEN show. You do not need to belong to a guild to enter this competition!

- 1. Items must be at least 85% leather. Excludes picture frames, furniture, beadwork, etc.
- 2. Mailed items will be tagged when received. Walk in entries will be tagged at the registration desk.
- 3. No "notes" on the item.
- 4. One entry per class
- 5. No kits in Masters division
- 6. If you compete in IFOLG, you MUST compete in your current Division. IFOLG & affiliated guild members who compete outside of their current division will be disqualified.
- 7. Judges decisions will be final. This is not life or death. If you don't win, please don't complain. You will be ignored. There is no governing authority to complain to. Deal with it.
- 8. Observe published deadline. It is absolute. That means no exceptions.
- 9. Head Judge is Ava Gannon
- 10. You will sign that you have read these rules on your entry form.

11. Scribes and Judges always needed. Contact Alex Madson if you can help out.

#### **CATEGORY B: CASES**

Class B – 4 Holsters or sheaths attached to a belt or strap

Class B – 5 Purses, carved (handbags, shoulder bags, fanny packs, sporrans, etc.)

Class B – 6 Purses, stamped<sup>6</sup> (handbags, shoulder bags, fanny packs, sporrans, etc.)

Class B - 7 Purses, other<sup>7</sup>

Class B – 8 Books or book covers (scrapbooks, album covers, notebooks, ring binders, etc.)

#### CATEGORY C: POCKET ITEMS

Class C – 1 Billfolds or wallets, carved (billfolds, wallets, checkbooks, pocket secretaries, etc.)

Class C – 2 Billfolds or wallets, stamped<sup>6</sup> (billfolds, wallets, checkbooks, pocket secretaries, etc.)

Class C – 3 Billfolds or wallets, other<sup>7</sup> (billfolds, wallets, checkbooks, pocket secretaries, etc.)

Class C – 4 Pocket items, carved, stamped<sup>6</sup> or other<sup>7</sup> (card cases, key cases, fobs, eyeglass cases, coin purses or any other item which may be carried in a pocket EXCLUDING billfolds)

Class C – 5 Clutch purses, carved

Class C – 6 Clutch purses, stamped<sup>6</sup>

Class C – 7 Clutch purses, other

#### CATEGORY D: WEARING APPAREL

Class D – 1 Belts<sup>9</sup>, carved

Class D – 2 Belts<sup>9</sup>, stamped<sup>6</sup>

Class D – 3 Belts<sup>9</sup>, braided (Or belt strip may be decorated with braid lace appliqué)

Class D – 4 Belts<sup>9</sup>, other<sup>7</sup>

Class D – 5 Wearing apparel (clothing, hats, gloves, armor, footwear & sleeve cuffs.) $^{10}$ 

Class D-6 Accessory items (hatbands, wristbands, spur straps, collars. Jewelry, leather buckles, etc. Leather must be incorporated in overall design.)

#### CATEGORY E: LARGE COMPLEX ITEMS

Class E – 1 Saddles, carved or stamped, minimum 12" tree<sup>13</sup>. (Please include a note listing what kind of horse & circumstance of use, i.e. roping, trail riding, cutting, etc.)

Class E-2 Horse gear (bridles, breast collars, harness, hobbles, whips, reins & any similar item used to control a horse.)

Class E-3 Furniture) tables, chairs, stools, desks, etc. Leather must be visible on at least 50% of the exterior surface of the piece.)

#### CATEGORY F: HOUSEHOLD ITEMS, ART OBJECTS & OTHER

Class F – 1 Molded Leather items (leather items molded or formed over any medium other than leather.)

Class F – 2 Sculpted leather items (Must be 95% leather & can not be formed over any other medium except leather.)

Class F – 3 Household items<sup>11</sup> (Anything that can be used in the home, office, etc. But which does not qualify in any other class)

Class F – 4 Historic duplications and all black powder items

Class F – 5 Miscellaneous (canes, rifle slings & any other leather item for which there is no specific class.)

# ADVANCED DIVISION (H, I, J, K, L & M)

#### **CATEGORY H: PICTURES**

Class H – 1 Pictures, uncolored<sup>2</sup>, flat, under 100 square inches<sup>3</sup>

Class H – 2 Pictures, uncolored<sup>2</sup>, flat, over 100 square inches<sup>3</sup>

Class H – 3 Pictures, colored, flat, under 100 square inches<sup>3</sup>

Class H – 4 Pictures, colored, flat, over 100 square inches<sup>3</sup>

Class H – 5 Pictures, embossed<sup>4</sup>

Class H – 6 Pictures, 3– dimensional<sup>5</sup>

Class H – 7 Pictures, Leather–framed leather pictures – any size, any technique with or without color.

Both picture and frame will be judged.

#### **CATEGORY I: CASES**

Class I – 1 Large carrying or sporting cases includes holsters or knife sheaths with belt(s) attached.

Class I – 2 Small carrying or sporting cases includes holsters or knife sheaths WITHOUT belt(s) attached.

Class I - 3 Purses, carved or stamped<sup>6</sup>

Class I – 4 Purses, other<sup>7</sup>

Class I – 5 Books or book covers8

#### **CATEGORY J: POCKET ITEMS**

Class J – 1 Billfolds or wallets, carved or stamped<sup>6</sup> (checkbook covers, pocket secretaries, etc.)

Class J - 2 Billfolds or wallets, other (checkbook covers, pocket secretaries, etc.)

Class J – 3 Pocket items, carved, stamped<sup>6</sup>, or other<sup>7</sup>. (Card cases, key cases, fobs, eyeglass cases, coin purses or any other item, which may be carried in a pocket excluding billfolds)

Class J – 4 Clutch purses, carved or stamped<sup>6</sup>

Class J – 5 Clutch purses, other<sup>7</sup>

#### CATEGORY K: WEARING APPAREL

Class K – 1 Belts<sup>9</sup>, carved Class K – 2 Belts<sup>9</sup>, stamped<sup>6</sup>

Class K – 3 Belts, braided, other<sup>7</sup>

Class K – 4 Wearing apparel<sup>10</sup> (clothing, hats, gloves, armor, footwear & sleeve cuffs)

Class K – 5 Accessory items (hatbands, wristbands, spur straps, collars, jewelry, leather buckles, etc.

Leather must be incorporated in overall design.)

#### CATEGORY L: LARGE COMPLEX ITEMS

Class L – 1 Saddles, carved or stamped, minimum 12" tree<sup>13</sup>. (Please include a note listing what kind of horse & circumstance of use, i.e. roping, trail riding, cutting, etc.)

Class L – 2 Horse gear (bridles, breast collars, harness, hobbles, whips, reins & any similar item used to control a horse.)

Class L –3 Furniture) tables, chairs, stools, desks, etc. Leather must be visible on at least 50% of the exterior surface of the piece.)

#### CATEGORY M: HOUSEHOLD ITEMS, ART OBJECTS & OTHER

Class M-1 Molded & sculpted leather items (leather items molded or formed over any medium other than leather. Sculpted leather items must be 95% leather and must not be formed over any other medium except leather.)

Class M - 2 Household items<sup>11</sup> (Anything that can be used in the home, office, etc., but which does not qualify in any other class)

Class M - 3 Miscellaneous - any leather for which there is no specific category or class.

# MASTERS DIVISION (Q, R, S, T, U & W)

#### CATEGORY Q: PICTURES

Class O – 1 Pictures, uncolored<sup>2</sup>, flat

Class Q – 2 Pictures, colored, flat

Class Q – 3 Pictures, embossed<sup>4</sup>

Class Q – 4 Pictures, 3 – dimensional<sup>5</sup>

Class Q – 5 Pictures, Leather–framed leather pictures – any size, any technique

#### **CATEGORY R: CASES**

Class R – 1 Large carrying or sporting cases includes holsters or knife sheaths with belt(s) attached (camera cases, briefcases, scabbards, golf bags, saddlebags. quivers, pistol caddies, etc.)

Class R-2 Small carrying or sporting cases includes holsters or knife sheaths WITHOUT belt(s) attached (camera cases, briefcases, scabbards, golf bags, saddlebags, quivers, pistol caddies, etc.)

Class R – 3 Purses, carved or stamped<sup>6</sup>, other<sup>7</sup>

Class R – 4 Books or book covers8, carved, stamped<sup>6</sup> or other<sup>7</sup>

#### **CATEGORY S: POCKET ITEMS**

Class S – 1 Billfolds or wallets, carved or stamped<sup>6</sup> or other<sup>7</sup> (billfolds, wallets, checkbook covers, pocket secretaries, etc.)

Class S - 2 Pocket items – carved or stamped<sup>6</sup>, other<sup>7</sup> (card cases, key cases, fobs, eyeglass cases, coin purses or any other item which may be carried in a pocket, excluding billfolds)

Class S – 3 Clutch purses, carved or stamped<sup>6</sup> or other<sup>7</sup>

#### CATEGORY T: WEARING APPAREL

Class T – 1 Belts<sup>9</sup>, carved, stamped<sup>6</sup> or braided or other<sup>7</sup>

Class T - 2 Wearing apparel<sup>10</sup> (clothing, hats, gloves, armor, footwear)

Class T – 3 Accessory items: Hatbands, wristbands, spur straps, collars. jewelry, leather buckles, etc.. Leather must be incorporated in overall design.)

#### CATEGORY U: LARGE COMPLEX ITEMS

Class U-1 Saddles, carved or stamped, minimum 12" tree<sup>13</sup>. (Please include a note listing what kind of horse & circumstance of use, i.e. roping, trail riding, cutting, etc.)

Class U-2 Horse gear (bridles, breast collars, harness, hobbles, whips, reins & any similar item used to control a horse.)

Class U-3 Furniture) tables, chairs, stools, desks, etc. Leather must be visible on at least 50% of the exterior surface of the piece.)

#### CATEGORY W: HOUSEHOLD ITEMS, ART OBJECTS & OTHER

Class W -1 Molded & Sculptured leather items (leather items molded or formed over any medium other than leather. Sculpted leather items must be 95% leather & cannot be formed over any other medium except leather.)

Class W - 2 Household items<sup>11</sup> (Anything that can be used in the home, office, etc., but which does not qualify in any other class)

Class W - 3 Miscellaneous - any leather for which there is no specific category or class.

#### SPECIAL (Z)

#### CATEGORY Z: SPECIAL

- Class Z 1: Juniors, (anyone 18 years or younger).
- Class Z 2: Seniors, (anyone 65 years or older).
- Class Z 3: Beginners. (Anyone with less than two (2) years experience in leather craft).
- Class Z 4: Handicapped, (anyone having visual or motor skill difficulties).
- Class Z 5: Partnership items, any item made by two (2) or more persons.  $^{12 \& 14}$
- Z 5 Open Division (the highest rated partner is competing in Open division)
- Z 5 Advanced Division (the highest rated partner is competing in Advanced division)
- Z 5 Masters Division (the highest rated partner is competing in Masters division)
- Z 5 Special Division (both partners are competing in Special Z only)

#### **FOOTNOTES**

- 1. All pictures must be properly hung or displayed. The frame and/or mounting will not be considered part of the picture. (Except Call A-9, H-6, and Q-5.)
- 2. Definition of "uncolored"- Nothing added to the leather in the form of dye, paint, stain, antique or colored finishes.
- 3. Picture sizes are determined by multiplying the average width by the average height in inches.
  - (i.e. A 9" x 11" picture = 99 square inches. A 9" x 12 " 108 square inches.)
- 4. Definition of "embossed" One visible layer of leather only. Raised by undercutting, stretching, etc.
- 5. Definition of "3 Dimensional": use of more than one visible layer of leather or other material. Visible parts of picture must be 90% leather.
- 6. On all stamped articles Swivel knife cuts for accent only (not to exceed 10% of total surface area. (Knife cuts not to be beveled except as border.) Beveling accepted in conjunction with stamps.
- 7. Not carved or stamped. Any type of leather. May be decorated by any combination of color, stitching, burning, beadwork, hardware, etc.
- 8. Book covers & notebooks must contain book or paper pad. Ring binders must contain at least one sample page.
- 9. Belts must include attached buckles and keeper(s) if necessary. Holes must be appropriately punched if a mechanical or trophy buckle is used.
- 10. Any technique, including carving or stamping. Any leather combinations. May be decorated by stitching, burning, beadwork, studs, conchos, etc.
- 11. Jewelry boxes, cigar boxes, humidors, picture frames (Note: frames can not contain a leather picture). If an item is made to hold something specific (i.e. paper towels, cigars, etc.), please include it so that the piece will be functionally complete.
- 12. You can enter Z 5 Class only once (one time). Switching partners (or teams) in order to enter several items is prohibited.
- 13. Each stamping tool cannot exceed 3 square inches.
- 14. Items entered in the Z- 5 Class of Special Z Division, shall be entered in the Division Rating of the highest rated partner, (i.e. Open, Advanced, Masters, or Special).
