What one item requires so little material, makes a great 4H or useful beginner project that every seasoned leatherworker will make time and time again, be a valued addition to any home, find continued use year after year, and be well received by a man and / or woman.

What person doesn't have at least one or two pairs of scissors, garden shears, or fishing pliers, and owns a leather case to protect them?

In this class, Leatherworker Kim A. Soladine takes a different approach at stamping, and carving Traditional and Landscape designs. Using only the Basic 7 tools, plus 2 of Kim's favorite tools that most every experienced or beginner leatherworker should have amoung their collection of tools, you will start with methods of tempering leather, ending with finishing and hand stitching.

Stone Leather shears (super shears)

the Basic '7' Tool set, Leather & additional supplies, and other needed tools are provided.

If time allows, Kim will demonstrate his full color painting style using little more than the three primary colors. Kim brings to the class his 30 plus years experience as a Designer / Artist in Visual Communications and hopes each participant leaves with more than the knowledge of how to make and decorate a scissor case.
